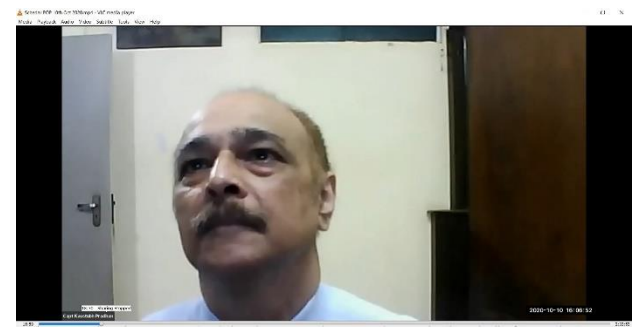

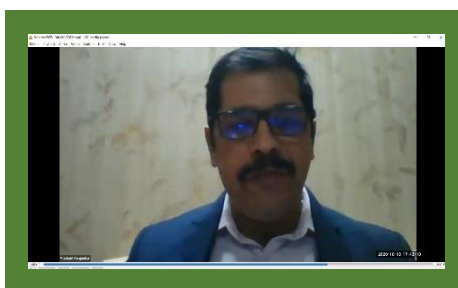

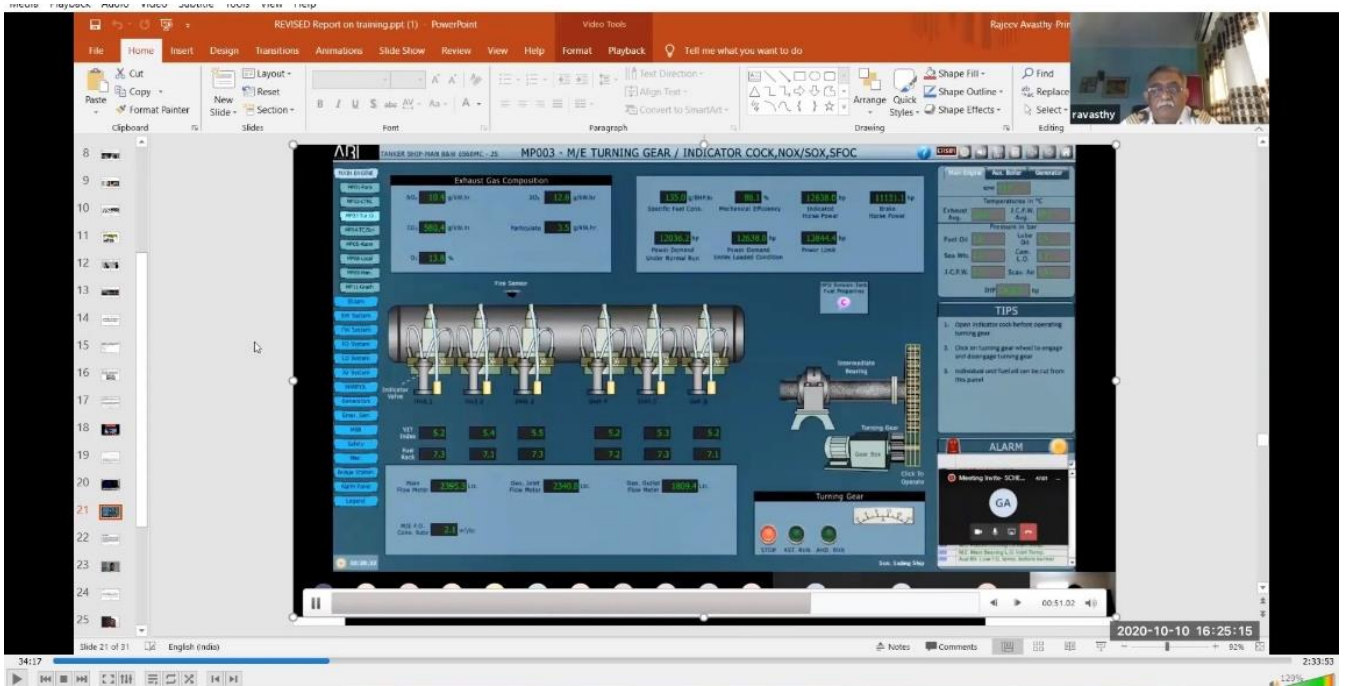

how ARI has responded to the challenges thrown by the pandemic to the maritime training sector and

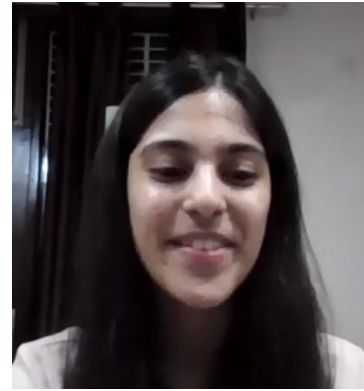

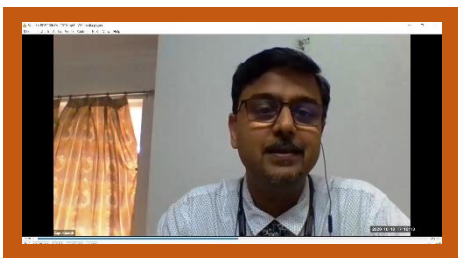
